SOME HELPFUL REMINDERS:

- 1. ANALYZE THE MELODY TO DETERMINE NONCHORD TONES AND OTHER PLACES TO USE APPROACH TECHNIQUES.
- 2. ON THE EIGHTH NOTES AND TRIPLETS THE LINES TAKE PRECEDENT OVER THE VOICINGS.
- 3. On the half and whole notes the voicings are more important than the lines.
- 4. MAINTAIN MOSTLY A 5 NOTE DENSITY.
- 5. VARY THE TEXTURE TO INCLUDE SOME SPREAD VOICINGS AND CLOSE AND SEMI-OPEN POSITIONS.

Example 17-9, page 157, is in a straight eighth-note feel and in two parts. **Part one**, measures 1-13, demonstrates using the saxophones as a background accompaniment to a melody or improvised solo. **Part two**, measures 14-25, is a saxophone soli. Notice the changes in density from unison/octaves to 5 part and spread voicings in the final two measures. Study this example and listen to CD Track #35.
